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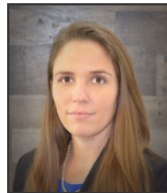

Practical Legal Expectations of the Fire Investigator, 2 Hours

Jason Mardirosian

Jason has an extensive background in fire, arson, and explosion investigations for both the public and private sectors. Having 17 years' experience with the Chicago Fire Department's Office of Fire Investigations and over 23 years of experience conducting investigations potentially involving Subrogation, Liability, and Fraud, as well as forensic consultation for various law firms in personal injury and wrongful death litigation. Currently, he specializes in forensic fire and explosion matters of significant Subrogation potential, personal injury, and third-party liability concerns. He has taught independently and in a team setting for various agencies and groups, including Illinois, Ohio, Wisconsin, Indiana, New York, Seattle, WA, Alaska, and the U.S. Virgin Islands/St. Croix, Texas, Maine, Jamaica, and several ATF task force programs. He is certified by the International Association of Arson Investigators to teach the Evidence Collection Technician certification class and the Fundamental Fire/Arson Investigator course. Also, he have taught internationally in Algiers, Algeria (Africa) for Engility Corporation on behalf of the United States Department of Justice and the ICITAP program as a forensic advisor/Law Enforcement consultant teaching arson and explosion scene investigations, evidence collection & analysis, as well as, advanced curriculum, to the Investigators and Laboratory personnel from the Defense Ministry and the National Police from the Ministry of the Interior & Fire brigade. He was also hired to conduct a comprehensive operational assessment of the Fire Investigation and Forensic Engineering unit of the Dubai Police Department, Ministry of the Interior, United Arab Emirates. Lastly, he was awarded the International Investigator of the Year award from the International Association of Arson Investigators (IAAI) in 2006, as well as the Investigator of the Year/ Harry Schaefer award for the State of Illinois in 2006.

NICB Services & Vehicle Identification

Beyond digital data, this course dives into the physical "nuts and bolts" of vehicle forensics. You will learn expert techniques for locating confidential/hidden VINs and utilizing NICB services to identify vehicles that have been severely damaged or burned beyond recognition. Whether you are working a routine theft or a complex arson case, this course delivers the technical knowledge needed to identify the unidentifiable.

Special Agent Dave Sicilian serves with the National Insurance Crime Bureau (NICB) in Tampa, where he leads initiatives with the Suncoast Auto Theft Intelligence Unit and promotes collaboration between law enforcement and insurance partners. With more than 32 years in law enforcement—including 25 as a supervisor with the Columbus (Ohio) Division of Police—his experience spans homicide, narcotics, internal affairs, and accident investigation. He is a BERLA-certified Vehicle Forensics Technician and Examiner and a former criminal justice instructor. Dave has over 35 years of public speaking and training experience and is recognized for his expertise in auto theft investigations and intelligence sharing.

Fatal Fire Investigation Course: How the Human Body Burns and What is Left for Investigators at the Fatal Fire Scene (Part 1)

The Fatal Fire Investigation Course is based on the scientific approach of documenting how the human body burns and what remains as evidence of the victim's body after the fire. This training is derived from 20+ years of experimental research that has documented how the human body burns within different fire environmental settings, the heat-related changes of the body's layered soft tissues and bones, and the movements of the body and limb flexion (pugilistic posture), what survives the after fire, and what the investigator should look for as evidence of victim's burned remains at the fatal fire scene, and the effective methods for search and recovery of burned human remains that are considered 'burned beyond recognition'.

Elayne Pope, Ph.D., Forensic Anthropologist at Fatal Fire Research and Education

Dr. Elayne Pope is the Director of Fatal Fire Research and Education, who studies how the human body burns during vehicle, structure, outdoor, and incendiary fire events. She provides ongoing training for fire investigators, law enforcement, crime scene investigators, and medicolegal death investigators/coroners, and is a subject-matter expert in Fire Fatality Investigations. Dr. Pope examines thermal damage on burned human remains and bones as it applies to forensic casework in legal proceedings.

Fire Dynamics, Ventilation, and Compartment Fire Dynamics (4 hours)

This course addresses eight of the sixteen minimum job performance requirements (JPRs) outlined in NFPA 1033 (Standard for Professional Qualifications for Fire Investigator) necessary to perform as a fire investigator. Basic

scientific and engineering principles relating to fire dynamics are taught in conjunction with relevant case studies and practical demos.

This course begins with a review of the fundamentals of fire dynamics principles and builds upon that with an introduction to more advanced topics, including compartment fire dynamics, damage dynamics, and multiple interactive case studies. Damage dynamics is a methodology used to assist in determining the origin of a fire within a complex compartment based upon knowledge of available fuel locations, as well as the ventilation sources. The interactive case studies will allow groups of investigators to view photographs from complex training cells in order to make origin determinations. After the groups have determined an origin for each case study, photos, videos, and data collected during the fires will be presented to the group.

Jonathan Butta, PE -ATF Fire Research Laboratory

Jonathan Butta currently works full-time as a Fire Research Engineer with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF) Fire Research Laboratory (FRL), located in Beltsville, MD. He graduated from the Department of Fire Protection Engineering at the University of Maryland with a Bachelor of Science degree in May 2012 and a Master of Engineering in December of 2017.

Smoking Materials as Ignition Sources (4 hours)

Smoking materials are frequently cited as the cause of fires. According to NFPA, 16,500 fires were caused by smoking materials in 2016, down nearly 77% since 1980. The introduction of smoke-resistant furnishings, Fire Standard Complaint (FSC) cigarettes, and declines in cigarette consumption have reduced the likelihood of these events in recent years but not eliminated them. This course will provide a review of the thousands of cigarette ignition trials conducted at the ATF Fire Research Laboratory over the last 20 years, with a focus on how the fire investigator should consider smoking materials when determining the cause of fires. The course will culminate in an afternoon of hands-on cigarette tests, during which small groups of investigators will attempt to ignite various fuels with lit cigarettes, record their results, and present them to the class.

In the Hot Seat: Legal Considerations for the Public Investigator – Report Writing and Courtroom Testimony in Arson Cases.

This course will focus on understanding the basics of arson laws, report writing skills, courtroom testimony skills, tips, and tricks. Understanding the law and the basics of how to write high-quality reports will assist investigators in building strong cases for successful prosecutions. Additionally, understanding the basics of testifying in court,

including how to write a CV to become an expert, will allow the investigator to successfully communicate the evidence to a jury and the court to secure a conviction in the cases that are charged.

As the Supervisor of that unit, Katy oversees 2 misdemeanor ASAs and up to 7 felony ASAs. In her time as an ASA, Katy has been involved in approximately 150 trials, including over 30 jury trials. Katy also serves as the Kane County SAO's liaison to the Kane County Arson Task Force. She regularly puts on training for the Arson Task Force to assist members in report writing skills, courtroom testimony skills and discussing the importance of collaborative work between the legal and investigative work the two entities perform. Since 2024, Katy has also been presenting at NIPSTA to the fire investigator classes regarding report writing, courtroom testimony, and search warrants. She presented to the Illinois and Iowa chapters of the IAAI in January of 2026 regarding legal topics in arson investigations at their annual Midwest training conference. Katy is passionate about teaching others and sharing her knowledge to assist investigators in building stronger cases for the Courtroom.

The Bureau of Fire, Arson, and Explosives Investigations is a crucial law enforcement bureau within the Criminal Investigations Division. Its sworn and nonsworn personnel play key roles within the criminal justice system, with core missions that include detecting, investigating, apprehending, and prosecuting offenders of arson and explosive-related crimes. The Bureau also works to enhance investigations and prosecutions and to deter arson and explosive-related crimes through education and training.

The Bureau is divided into two operational districts: District One and District Two. District One comprises the Northeast and Northwest regions, and District Two comprises the North Central, South Central, and South regions. These five regions respond to requests for service and provide investigative support to fire, police, citizens, and visitors of Florida. The Bureau also supports the Division's Special Operations Bomb Squad, UAV, SRT, and K-9 units.

Due to the complexity, arduousness, and inherently dangerous nature of fire and arson investigations, the Bureau does not investigate every fire in Florida. However, upon request, Bureau officers can respond 24 hours a day, seven days a week, to investigate fires and explosion-related incidents.

We are working harder than ever to ensure those responsible for arson are apprehended and prosecuted. If you have any information regarding a suspected arson, we encourage residents to report Arson Tips through the Arson Tip Hotline at 1-877-NO-ARSON (662-7766). Any information leading to a successful arrest and prosecution may be eligible for a cash reward.

Annual Scholarship Guidelines:

Scholarships will be granted annually. The scholarships given will be determined by the Awards Committee with the approval of the Executive Board and Regional Directors. To be eligible, applicants must be a member in good standing with the Florida Chapter of the International Association of Arson Investigators. Applications must be postmarked no later than September 1, 2026. Applications postmarked after that date will not be considered.

Ryan Ward Scholarship

The Ryan Ward Scholarship was established to honor the memory of Ryan Ward. The son of lifetime member Jack Ward, Ryan was training to become a fire investigator in the family tradition of his father at the time of his tragic death at the age of 23. Ryan was a dedicated and involved member of the Florida Chapter. A scholarship will be awarded annually to a fire service member for training in fire investigation under this program. The scholarship will cover the cost of registration, hotel room, and any meals at the host hotel. The applicant would be responsible for his or her own transportation.

Larry Weintraub Scholarship

The Larry Weintraub Scholarship was established to honor one of the great pioneers in the field of fire investigations. Larry Weintraub has spent decades working in fire investigations in both the public and private sectors. He has been involved in the Florida Chapter since 1973. Larry has held many positions with the Florida Chapter, including chapter President. In 1999, Larry was given the Distinguished Life Member Award. Larry is also known for his role in the discovery of open neutral phenomena. The scholarship is awarded annually. The scholarship covers the cost of registration and hotel stay for the Annual Conference. The applicant would be responsible for his or her own transportation and food. Requirements: The applicant must be hard-working and dedicated, with a strong will to never give up! This is open to members of the chapter in good standing.

Past Presidents Scholarship

Two (2) scholarships will be granted annually. The Past Presidents Scholarship was established to provide financial means for a participant who would not otherwise have the opportunity to attend the training. Anyone who is actively engaged in some phase of Arson Investigation or the administration of justice at the time is encouraged to apply for the scholarship. The scholarship is awarded annually. The scholarship covers the cost of registration to the Annual Conference. The applicant would be responsible for his or her

William “Bumper” Moylan Memorial Scholarship
