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SB 868: Practice of the Profession of Pharmacy

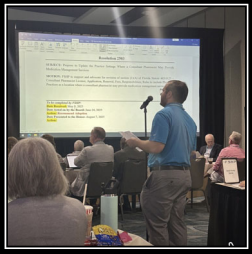

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HB 273: Pharmacy
GENERAL BILL by Chaney

Pharmacy: authorized registered pharmacy technicians to handle sales transactions & delivery of dispensed drugs; provides for permitting of remote-site pharmacies; requires that licensed or consultant pharmacist serve as prescriber; department manager of remote-site pharmacy requires remote-site pharmacist to verify 100% of change in pharmacy's prescriber department manager within specified timeframe; provides requirements for remote-site pharmacist; authorizes remote-site pharmacist to store, hold, & dispense medical drugs; prohibits dispensing of Schedule II medications at remote-site pharmacy unless pharmacist is present; requires prescriber department manager to visit remote-site pharmacy, based on certain standards, to perform specified tasks; prohibits remote-site pharmacist from being open when supervising pharmacy's closed unless certain pharmacist is present or providing remote supervision at remote-site pharmacy; creates registered pharmacist serving as prescriber department manager for remote-site pharmacy from certain practice territories

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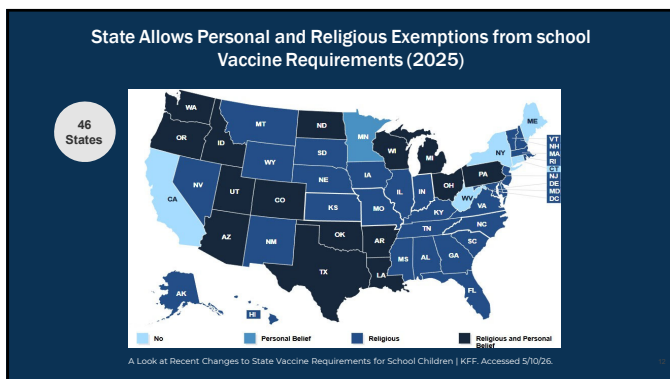

Drug Prices and Coverage: Revises definition of term "pharmacy benefits plan or program" to exclude plan or program that exclusively serves RCE organizations; requires contracts between pharmacy benefit managers & participating pharmacies to allow specified option in administrative appeal procedure; provides pharmacy benefit manager prohibited practices relating to pharmacies & pharmacists. APPROPRIATION: \$30,901,911

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Pharmacy PBM Bill HB 697

Requires pharmacy benefit manager contracts to allow a consolidated administrative appeal for multiple claims of the same drug and day supply in the same month.

Prohibits pharmacy benefit managers from preventing pharmacies or pharmacists from declining to dispense a medication if reimbursement is below acquisition cost.

Bars pharmacy benefit managers from reimbursing affiliated pharmacies more than non-affiliated pharmacies for the same services.

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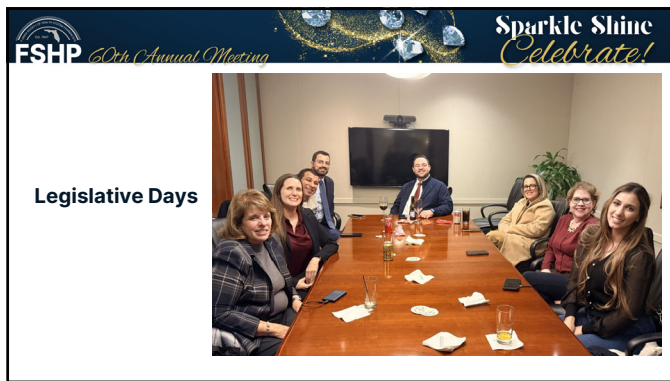

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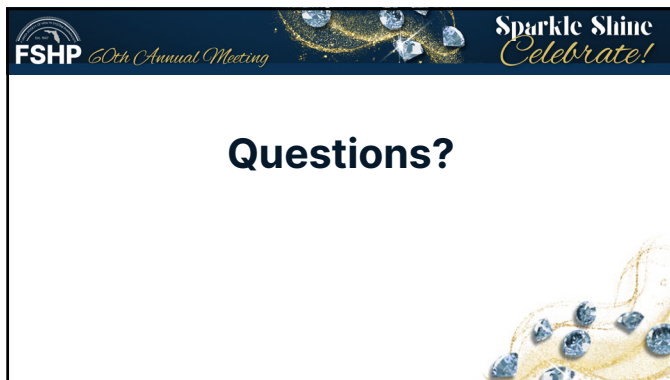
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
